

How to Teach Writing Using TWF

The Write Foundation is a writing system that comes as fully prepared lesson plans complete with quality teaching tools: thorough writing instruction, examples, suggested answers, daily schedules, grading guidelines, writing and grammar games, and more. Teaching Tools

Everything you need to teach writing is included in each writing lesson. Use the **instruction manual** and display the **teacher presentation (TP)** information, while students take notes on the **worksheets (WS)**.

1. Before teaching a lesson, quickly review the lesson in the **instruction manual**, and then keep it handy for reference during the lesson. The instruction manual includes teaching instructions, with **teacher presentation (TP)** information, answers and examples.
2. **Worksheets (WS)** are for students' notes that they will need to complete their independent writing assignments. The worksheets come in the order presented in the **instruction manual**.
3. The **teacher presentation (TP)** coordinates with the **instruction manual** and the **worksheets (WS)**, showing information needed to complete the **worksheets (WS)**. All of the information needed for the **teacher presentation (TP)** is in the **instruction manual**.

Lesson Presentation

One or two students can take notes directly from the **teacher presentation (TP)** information in the instruction manual, and a white board or another surface as the teacher writes information with student input. For one student or multiple students the teacher presentation information also comes in two (2) Teacher Presentation (TP) folders, found in the Additional Resources, which can be displayed on a computer or overhead transparency. These are designed with slightly different formats, but include the same information. Any of these techniques or a combination of these techniques works.

- **Computer:** Teacher presentation information comes in a digital interactive format in the Additional Resources. These may be typed on while being viewed on a computer monitor or projector.
- **Overhead Projector:** Teacher presentation information comes in a black and white format in the Additional Resources to be printed on transparencies.
- **Other surfaces** can be used with or instead of the digital teacher presentation pages. A white board is a viable alternative to use to present information directly from the instruction manuals. Chalkboards, blank paper, and chart tablets are other alternatives if a white board is not available.

Many are overwhelmed with the idea of teaching writing, because when it is not broken down correctly, it is a very complex subject to teach and learn. The Write Foundation has taken this complex subject and broken it down into pieces, and then arranged the pieces into lesson plans for you to easily use.
